The purpose of both tests is to gain admission to a 4 year college or university

The SAT or ACT is not required for community college, but if your scores are high enough it may waive the need for placement

testing!

Subjects: English, Reading, Math, Science, Optional Essay Scoring: Scale of 1-36. Subjects: Reading, Writing & Language, Math Scoring: Scale of 400-1600
